## Noteworthy:

**Program of Studies**- This booklet provides a course description for each course offered to 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders. It is beneficial to assist incoming students in understanding the required courses and discussing the elective options with parents/guardians.

**Encore-** The majority of our students experience these four quarter workshops, exploring each course for a ten-week marking period: Design Engineering, Applied Technology, Money Smart, and Spanish.

Math Placement - Students will be placed in one of three levels: General, Advanced, or Honors. All 7<sup>th</sup> grade math levels are designed to give students the opportunity to move into an Algebra course in 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Placement will be determined through elementary teacher input using a recommendation rubric reflecting learning tendencies at each level, i.e. independent learning, homework completion, ability to show work in sequential order, etc. The math placement for a CST student will be aligned with the IEP.
