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SRMS Schedule Overview

- Bus StopBus pick-up is generally between 6:45-7:10 am.Be at your scheduled bus stop 10 minutes prior to pick-up time.Bus information will be accessible on the student schedule.
- 7:25-7:36 Exit buses and report to café or gym as directed to await dismissal to homeroom.
- 7:45 The school day begins. Any student reporting to school late must report to the Greeter's Desk at the front entrance to check-in.
- 2:12 The regular school day ends.
- 3:00 / 5:15 Activity periods end (for clubs, extra help, HW Habitat, sports). Buses are provided.

Students are scheduled for eight periods of 44 minutes each. The lunch/literacy period is the exception - the period is split between lunch and literacy (sustained silent reading). Seventh graders will eat lunch during the first half of the period and have literacy the second half of the period.

The bell schedule is posted on the website.

Teams/Classes

All students are assigned to a team:

Generally, a majority of classes for each student will be in the same team hallway.

The hallways are both color coded and letter named to help students navigate the building. Signs for common areas such as the cafeteria, gym, and N hall are posted.

Students are scheduled for English, math, science, social studies, encore or elective, physical education, and lunch/literacy. English and math are composed of a full year course and a half year course each; students alternate marking periods for the half-year courses.

Encore and Elective Classes

Encore consists of four ten-week courses:

Full year electives: Band, Chorus, or Strings (in 8th grade, Spanish I by recommendation or JROTC)

Homework/Extra Help/Homework Habitat

Homework

Homework makes up a percentage of the grade in each class. It is imperative for students to complete the assigned homework every night. One of the major reasons students earn a failing grade in middle school is because they don't do their homework. Don't let this happen to you! Make it a habit to stay organized and record assignments, extra help days, club meetings, etc.

Extra Help

Teachers may offer extra help after school from 2:15-3:00. It is important to keep up with schoolwork on a regular basis and make up work quickly if you have been absent. If you don't understand something, ask for help! Your teacher will announce extra help days in advance. Record these in your agenda book.

Homework Habit

Homework Habitat is generally open from 2:15-3:00 on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays. Students will get a pass for the 3:00 PM bus.

Participation is on a sign-up basis. Sign-up in the HW Habitat portion of the Student Dashboard on our website.



Agenda Book and Student Handbook

Agenda Book

To assist with the transition to middle school, each seventh grader is provided with an agenda book to help keep them organized and informed. Students are expected to use the book daily to record homework, projects, club meetings, team events, extra help, etc. Eighth graders may also request an agenda book.



Student Handbook

The SRMS Student Handbook is posted on the website and provides a summary of the expectations, procedures, rules, dress code, eligibility rules for athletics, disciplinary guide, etc. The SRMS Writing Guidelines are also included. Updates are posted as needed.

Cell Phones/Ear Buds/Headphones and Dress Code

Cell Phones/Earbuds/Headphones

During the academic day, it is expected that students attend to academic matters and not allow electronics to be a distraction. Cell phones/earbuds/headphones should not be used during the academic day (7:36 am -2:12 pm), without teacher permission. All middle school students are issued Chromebooks; therefore, cell phones are not needed to access school materials.

> **NOTE:** Many ear buds go unclaimed in our lost and found each year. Identify your ear buds with a unique "discoverable as " name in your phone and label your case so that they can be easily returned to you if lost.

Dress Code

To maintain the decorum for learning, SRMS has a dress code policy which can be found in the SRMS Student Handbook posted on the middle school homepage.





Co-curricular Activities/Interscholastic Sports/Activity Day Picnic

One of the best parts of the day for SRMS students is after school! The extensive list of activities is available in the **Clubs and Activities Information link** posted on the SRMS homepage and at Club Coner by the cafeteria. Meeting dates and times will be announced during the morning announcements and displayed on the cafeteria and C hall TVs. Announcements for clubs, sports, and activities can also be found on the **MS Activities Calendar** and in the **Student Bulletin link** in the Middle School News box and in the Student Dashboard on our website. Remember, students must have a **Co-curricular Participation Consent Form** signed by a parent/guardian to participate in after-school clubs or activities. Links are posted in multiple locations on the website.

Late buses are provided at 3:00 and at 5:15 PM for students involved in after-school activities.

Students must be with a teacher or coach after school. Students may not walk to Wawa or the high school and return for a late bus. Only students with late bus passes from a teacher or coach will be permitted on the 3:00 or 5:15 pm bus.

Students who wish to attend after-school athletic events must be accompanied by a parent/guardian. School supervision is not provided for student spectators.



The <u>Activity Day Picnic</u> in May is the culminating activity for those participating in middle school after-school activities. <u>Students who finish a sport season or participate ten times in the same club or other SRMS activity will be eligible to attend the picnic</u>. Check out the **Clubs and Activities Information link** to find a club or sport to match your interests. Between 700-750 students qualify each year. Make plans to be part of the picnic!

Transportation

Busing

Bus stops and pick-up times will be found on the student schedule (accessed in the Parent Portal). In addition to the 2:12 pm close-of-school bus, 3:00 and 5:15 pm buses are provided to allow students to participate in after-school activities.

Student Drop-Off

Those choosing to drive students instead of using the provided busing must drop off and pick up in the back parking lot. Drivers are cautioned to be cognizant of the many students and faculty crossing between the parking lot and the building. Students should not be dropped off prior to 7:20 am and must report directly to the cafeteria or gym as directed to await dismissal to homeroom (if arriving before 7:36 am).

Walkers/Bikers

<u>Students should not arrive prior to 7:20 am</u>. Any student who arrives prior to 7:36 AM must report directly to the cafeteria or gym as directed to await dismissal to homeroom at 7:36 am. Walkers and bikers should observe all safety rules and the rules of the road. Bikers must wear helmets and lock bikes in the bike racks provided.





Parent Portal

The <u>Parent Portal has a cell phone shortcut for your home screen</u> or can be accessed via the school website. To begin each school year, **use the Parent Portal to complete important opening-of-school paperwork; during the year, use the Parent Portal to monitor your student's grades in each class and his/her attendance**. You are encouraged to use the portal regularly to assist your child in completing his/her assignments.

The opening-of-school forms portion of the Parent Portal will open in mid-August for the completion of the required paperwork. You will receive an email with information on how to access these forms. Call the MS Main Office if you need to update your email address (609-597-9481 x4216).

Preliminary schedules for 7th graders will be accessible via the Parent Portal once all opening-of-school forms have been completed within the portal after it is opened for that grade level in <u>mid-August</u>. (Preliminary schedules for 8th graders will be accessible via the Parent Portal once all opening-of-school forms have been completed within the portal after it is opened for that grade level in <u>late August</u>.) Note that scheduling changes may still occur after those dates.

Bus information is updated within the Parent Portal closer to the end of August.

Cafeteria Purchases



The online payment platform for cafeteria purchases is **PaySchoolsCentral**. <u>Instructions for setting up an account are available in the Food Services section of the</u> <u>SRSD website</u>. The program also allows you to view your child's cafeteria purchases.

If you wish to eliminate overdrafts/charges in the cafeteria, please submit a letter to your child's assistant principal indicating that you do not want to allow charging for purchases in the cafeteria (or set a limit such as not allowing accrual of more than \$10 in charges).

To apply for <u>free or reduced lunch</u>, use the online application within the Parent Portal or in the Food Services section of the SRSD website.

NOTE: <u>The application must be submitted each year to continue service or qualify for other assistance</u> <u>that may be available</u>. Service for the upcoming school year will require a current application.

Understanding **Google Classroom** will help you support your child's academic journey. Be sure you know how to use the calendar and how to navigate between the "stream" and the "classwork" sections. Contact your child's guidance counselor if you need assistance.

Homework counts. Failure to do homework is one of the major causes of failing grades at the middle school level. Please check the "Academic Support" link on the middle school homepage for some tools and suggestions to keep your child moving forward academically. Encourage your child to take advantage of Extra Help and HW Habitat.

Summer Reading instructions are posted on the SRSD homepage. This is the <u>first grade</u> for the full year English class and is <u>due the first Friday</u> of the school year.

The Common Supply List for all SRMS students is posted on the SRMS homepage.



Reminder: Students' preliminary schedules will be released once the necessary exchange of start-of-school information is complete. <u>The following forms must be completed in the Parent Portal once it is opened</u> <u>for the new school year:</u> contact, demographic, legal, and health information; handbook, curriculum, AI, and AUP acknowledgements; school district provided technology device and Securly forms; media release form; and the home language survey (for all incoming 7th graders and all other new students). An email reminder with instructions will be sent in mid-August.

Please be timely in your completion of the forms so that we have the information needed to keep your child safe and academically ready for the school year. Your assistance is greatly appreciated.

Notes: 1) Legal or custody issues must be properly documented to be enforced.
2) If health or contact information changes during the year, please contact your child's guidance counselor so that school records can be updated.
